## REGULATORY COMPLIANCE

Order dated 02<sup>nd</sup> February 2024 w.r.t Usage of the term "ORS" along with brand names was released in which FBOs are directed to ensure compliance with the conditions that they may use "ORS along with prefix or suffix in consonance

with section 17, Trade Marks Act, 1999 and to comply with the prominent declaration on their Front-of-Pack that 'The product is NOT an ORS formula as recommended by WHO'. Also they have to provide appropriate disclaimer as per FSS (Advertising and Claims) Regulations, 2018.

### **QUALITY ASSURANCE**

- 10 new microbiology laboratories have been inaugurated virtually by Honourable Prime Minister Shri. NarendraModi on 25th February 2024.
   These 10 microbiology laboratories have been successfully established in State Food Testing Laboratories (SFTLs) across eight States:
  - 1. Uttar Pradesh (Lucknow, Meerut),
  - 2. Kerala (Ernakulum, Kozhikode),
  - 3. Maharashtra (Mumbai),
  - 4. Chhattisgarh (Raipur),
  - 5. Assam (Guwahati),
  - 6. Delhi (North West Delhi),
  - 7. Andhra Pradesh (Vishakhapatnam) and
  - 8. Tamil Nadu (Coimbatore).
  - Work for "Setting up of Microbiological Section and Installation of Equipment on Turnkey Basis" is under process for the following laboratories: Aurangabad, Jaipur, Mysore, Thiruvananthapuram, Bengaluru, Belagavi, Bhubaneshwar, Vadodara, Patna, Bhopal, Solan, Varanasi and Ranchi.
- A total of 53 FSWs have been inaugurated on 25th February, 2024 virtually by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri. NarendraModi in different States/UTs, which include Assam (17), Andhra Pradesh (4), Chandigarh (1), Himachal Pradesh (3), Jammu & Kashmir (6{Jammu (3) & Srinagar (3)}), Meghalaya (2), Uttar Pradesh (18) and Uttarakhand (2).
  - In the month of February 2024, 3 FSWs have been sanctioned for the State of Orissa. This has increased the total number of sanctioned FSWs to 408. Out of the total sanctioned FSWs, 10 Food Safety on Wheels (FSWs) have been procured by the State of Assam and 3 FSWs by the State of Himachal Pradesh in the month of February. The total no. of FSWs deployed in the country is 238.
- FSSAI has successfully conducted Second batch of 9th FAE Practical

Examination on 3rd- 4th February 2024 at four different examination centres.

- 4 New applications of Rapid Analytical Food Testing (RAFT)
   Kit/Equipment/Method have been approved.
- FSSAI conducted 8 training programmes in the month of February for State Food Testing Laboratories and FSSAI Notified Laboratories. A total of 258 participants attended these training programmes. Details for which are as follows:

**Streamline Auditing & Enhancing Accountability**: A new feature that lets FSSAI authorities monitor important transactions (like license/registrations issued, inspection conducted, sampling etc.) based on dates and IP addresses.

## B) Food Safety Training and Certification:

- 1.) Provision for direct enrolment of already registered trainee while creating a new training calendar
- 2.) Authentication & Intimation to Trainer & Assessor while creating batchcode for FoSTaC training. An OTP will go to the Trainer and Assessor who have been selected for that training. The remark is visible to training partner as well
- 3.) Integration with FoSCoS for authentication of FoSTaC number while filling application in FoSCoS.
